- A book featuring money/banks, for MoneySmart week.
- Any audiobook.
- Any Ebook.
- A book with pictures.
- A book with a one word title.
- A book published in 2020.
- A book featured on any bestseller list.
- A book by 2 or more authors.
- A short story, novella, essay or poetry collection.
- A book mentioned in any webinar, podcast, staff training, or email sent to all KHCPL Staff.
- A book you found by using Novelist or Gale Books and Authors (part of our Gale Databases).
- A book about books or featuring books.
- A book with "library," "Howard," "bear," "read," "challenge" or "book" in the title.
- A book that is inspired by a literary classic, mythology, legends, fairytales, or folktales.
- A book from any celebrity reading club. (Oprah, Reece, Andrew Luck, etc...)
- A book told from multiple characters points of view.
- A book that makes you nostalgic.
- A book that is part of a series.
- A book set in a location you have visited or vacationed.
